



- **Save As** your picture as Name_Graphic.
- **Merge** your layers
- Go to **Image> Mode> Grayscale** (now it is black and white)
- Make a **duplicate layer**– work on this one
- Go to **Filter> Artistic >Poster Edge** - fiddle with the controls until it looks right to you (note the edges should be full enough so no colour bleeds out).



- To colour: Use the **Paint Bucket** to fill with colour. Make sure the continuous box is checked.
- You can also change the opacity on the colour.
- If colour bleeds out find the opening and close the gap with the pencil or brush tool (set to black)

To match an existing colour use the **Eyedropper** tool and click on the existing colour and the paint box colour box will change to that colour.



Option 2:

- Make a **Duplicate Layer**
- Go to **Filter> Blur> Smart Blur**. From the **Quality Option** select High and from the **Mode** option select **Edge Only**. The radius and Threshold sliders enable you to create more or fewer edges line (the default setting is usually fine) You will now have a black background with white lines
- Go to **Images> Adjustments> Invert** (or Ctrl I) and you will now have black lines on a white background.
- Colour as the instructions above
